STORM TEAM 600



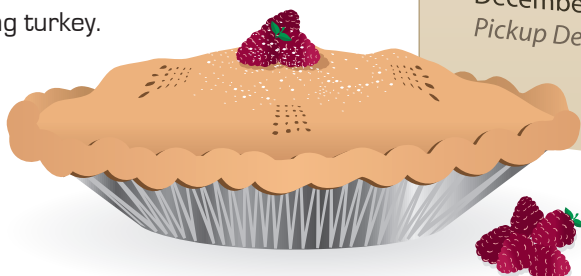

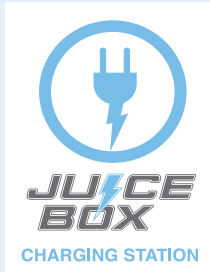
