1,000 Years

You may have noticed the new artwork in the hallway between Café 600 and the Atrium Café. The piece, "1,000 Years" by artist Evelyn Rydz, is an intricate pencil drawing of rope found along the East Coast, which has been arranged to trace the route of the "global conveyor belt."

What is the Global Conveyor Belt?


Thousands of meters below the ocean's surface, deep currents continuously circulate water around the world, a "conveyor belt" driven by water density, temperature, and saline content. When sea ice forms in the polar waters, it leaves salt in the water. Cold, salty water is dense and sinks to the bottom of the ocean; less dense, warmer water rises. A current is created when the dense water sinks and pulls the warmer water along the surface to replace it. In the Norwegian Sea, warm Gulf Stream water loses its heat, grows denser and sinks, but the Gulf Stream waters are continually pulled northward, and the cold bottom water continues to flow south, creating the conveyor belt sequence.

The drawing's title refers to the 1,000 years it takes the system to complete one full cycle.



Chef John Ebersole



Federal Reserve Plaza and Sodexo have partnered this year with the Campus Kitchens Project (CKP), to put our excess food products to good use feeding local families. CKP is a national leader in community service and a successful model of hunger relief. CKP student volunteers collect, prepare and distribute food each week from their UMass Boston location. Working with the Dorchester Boys and Girls Club and the Catholic Charities Youth Center, they provide an average of 200 meals each week. The students serve as gardeners, menu planners, cooks, drivers, and even teachers, participating with local schools in nutritional education. Massachusetts coordinator Liz Moniz, shown at left with Sodexo General Manager Mike Berry and Chef John Ebersole, sends a team each week to pick up food items from our kitchens that have been prepared but not served. Our very first pickup resulted in 125 meals, and so far we have donated more than 225 pounds of food.
