Completion of Multi-year Project Generating Lots of Interest

Real Estate Services installs 4 new generators to power building
in an emergency



Crane set up begins on Congress Street. Each generator weighs 76 tons.

Federal Reserve Plaza's five original emergency power generators have been replaced with four modern, more energy efficient generators, bringing to completion a large scale, multi-year project. The generators, which supply power in emergency situations, are important for life safety and to forestall any interruption in critical Boston Fed functions.



The first of the 4 emergency generators is lifted onto the lower roof. The generators' location was changed from B2 as part of the Bank's resiliency planning, to mitigate the impact of natural disasters and a potential rise in sea level.



Once the placement was complete, the complex process of bringing the new generators online began, with several weeks of programming and testing.
